

## Substitute House Bill 59 Omnibus Amendment Components

- HC1770 – Creates the Youth STEM Commercialization and Entrepreneurship Program and appropriates \$2 million in FY' 14 and \$3 million in FY' 15 for this purpose.
- HC1665 – Restores funding for Federally Qualified Health Centers to the FY' 13 appropriation.
- HC1741 – Grandfathers any existing pilot program that offers expanded Medicaid eligibility from the prohibition in the bill.
- HC1660-1 – Increases the Department of Developmental Disabilities IO waiver reimbursement and appropriates \$5.45 million per year for the cost.
- HC1773 – Augments line 322-508, Employment First Pilot Program, by \$2 million per year.
- HC1850 – Creates the Commercial Activity Tax Review Commission.
- HC1838 – Deletes language in the substitute bill requiring the Department of Commerce to establish a short-term loan database.
- HC1604 – Tweaks the pilot program in the Cleveland Metropolitan and Cincinnati Public School Districts to teach agricultural education created in the substitute bill by providing an additional \$5,000 per year for the Cincinnati Public School District.
- HC1998 – Allows a school district that levies a combined levy for current expenses and permanent improvements to replace or renew the levy solely for permanent improvements and to change the term of the levy.
- HC1759-1 – Revises language added in the substitute bill regarding a non-compliant NPEDS permit holder who operates a confined animal feeding operation by strengthening the penalties for violations.
- HC1591 – Requires the State Board of Education to review performance levels and benchmarks for report cards issued to dropout recovery community schools by December 31, 2014.
- HC1630 – Permits the Department of Education to decline sponsoring a community school whose contract has been terminated.
- HC1963 – Clarifies the revised distance for wind farm turbines is prospective.
- HC1863 – Provides \$250,000 per year for the Heidelberg Water Quality Lab.
- HC1688-2 – Increases 700-415, Poultry Inspection, by \$150,000 per year.
- HC1598 – Allows for the addition of a new juvenile judge in Summit County.
- HC1779 – Removes the elimination of the Motion Picture Tax Credit Program Fund and the related transfer of monies related to the fund.
- HC1596-1 – Authorizes county commissioners to create a Lake Facilities Authority to provide for watershed remediation.
- HC1588-2 – Eliminates the penalty levied on a distribution center that after the appeals process does not meet the definition of a qualified distribution center.
- HC1603 – Grants chauffeured limousines the ability to charge customers in a manner other than an hourly rate.
- HC1869-1 – Increases 235-443, Adult Basic and Literacy Education, by \$125,000 per year and earmarks the increase to allow public libraries to apply for remedial coursework instruction grants.

- HC1868 – Creates the Workforce Training Pilot Program for the Economically Disadvantaged and provides \$8 million per year for this purpose.
- HC1613 – Shortens the grace period video-service disconnections for non-payment to 15 days.
- HC1853 – Requires at least one member of the Department of Aging’s Board of Executives of Long-Term Services and Supports to be an administrator, owner or officer of a home health agency.
- HC2051 – Eliminates any education group from being eligible to receive grants from the Local Government Innovation Fund in FY’14 and loans from the fund in FY’15.
- HC1676-1 – Deletes language that directs the Department of Medicaid to rescind a rule regarding Medicaid payments rates for physician groups acting as outpatient hospital clinics.
- HC1837 – Initiates a license plate safety taskforce examining the extent of degradation over time and the effects on law enforcement and dual plates.
- HC2073 – Increases 490-414, Alzheimer’s Respite, by \$100,000 per year.
- HC1618 – Compels the rules the Director of the Department of Health adopts in establishing quality standards for ambulatory surgical facilities (ASF) to include a requirement that each ASF maintain an infection control program and specifies the forms required at inspection. Requires an inspection at an ASF that is not certified by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services during the license renewal process.
- HC2002 – Requires the Department of Education to create a study on gifted education funding.
- HC1653 – Allows two motorcycles to back into an unmetered parking space located to the side of and parallel to a road or highway. Permits one motorcycle to do the same when the spot is metered.
- HC1874 – Re-establishes the line 651-649, Medicaid Services – HCAP, and requires these funds be used for the distribution of the state share for all hospital care assurance program funds to hospitals.
- HC1862 – Increases 200-550, Foundation Funding by \$250,000 each year and earmarks that amount for home-schooled students to take Post-Secondary Enrollment Options Program courses.
- HC1761 – Revises the definitions of “mandatory services” and “optional services” to replace medical care with health care.
- HC2049 – Creates an exemption for the 90 day notice for a managed care organization to terminate their contract with a pharmacy provider if fraud, illegal activity, bankruptcy or insolvency occurs, or as otherwise stated in the contract.
- HC1621 – Clarifies the amendment process for a community reinvestment area created before July 22, 1994.
- HC1830 – Increases line 335-321, Continuum of Care Services, by \$665,196 per year and allocates that amount to the STAR House at the Ohio State University.
- HC2041 – Requires a managed care organization to provide ninety days when eliminating a contract for any health care provider and the availability of a drug on a preferred list or formulary.
- HC1715 – Restores the ability for the Department of Insurance to preform market conduct evaluations.
- HC1636 – Increases the accountability for school districts funds that are held by an Educational Service Center.

- HC1763 – Clarifies the application of a change included in the substitute bill in regards to language related to Convention Facilities Authorities.
- HC1995 – Earmarks \$500,000 in FY’ 14 from line 195-643, Workforce Development Initiatives, for a pilot program at the Central Ohio Technical College for heavy machinery training.
- HC1620 – Increases the penalty for the assault of an officer from a fifth degree to a third degree felony if the assault occurs at a state correctional institution by an inmate on an employee of the Departments of Rehabilitations and Corrections or Youth Services.
- HC2016-3 – Appropriates \$5 million per year for a new line item, Ready to Learn, and directs the Department of Education to contract with public and private early childhood education providers to fund early childhood education for children below 200% of the federal poverty level.
- HC1668 – Restores the current law definitions of “gas” and “production operation”.
- HC1666 – Adds to the definition of “county expenses” that can be paid to a county office by financial transaction devices, money confiscated during commitment of an individual to a county jail, bail, money from a prisoner’s account and money for goods and services obtained by or for the inmate by the sheriff.
- HC1938-1 – Allows an institution of higher education to provide investment options under an alternative retirement plan that meets the following requirements: 1) Has ten years experience in providing such a product, 2) Has provided investment options to at least one participant at 75% of the four year public institutions in Ohio, and 3) Has at least \$30 million in assets under management of alternative retirement plans.
- HC1642 – Requires an entity seeking funds from the Ohio Parenting and Pregnancy Program created in the substitute bill to promote childbirth and allows for the entity to provide services through a subcontractor.
- HC1712 – Reinstates a provision of current law that allows out of state students to be counted as a full time equivalent for law schools reimbursement under the State Share of Instruction formula.
- HC2007 – Transfers administrative authority for the four year tuition guarantee program from the Board of Regents to the Chancellor.
- HC1646 - Increases the threshold value of an unclaimed motor vehicle in relation to which the owner of a repair garage or place of storage may seek to obtain a certificate of title to \$5,000. Enables a towing company to seek to obtain the certificate of title to a vehicle, if the vehicle has been left with the towing company for more than 15 days. Alters the process that either a repair garage or a towing company must follow when seeking the certificate of title of an unclaimed vehicle.
- HC1727 – Clarifies the Department of Education cannot reimburse a college through the Post-Secondary Enrollment Options Program for courses that are not included in, or are equivalent to either a transfer module or transfer agreement guide developed by the Chancellor.
- HC1904 – Prohibits lottery tickets from being sold by telephone, computer or fax.
- HC1719 – Adds the Kent State University Columbus Program to the list of entities receiving \$75,000 per year from the Co-op & Internship Program, 235-649.
- HC2059 – Increases line 600-523, Family and Children Services, by \$1.5 million in FY’ 14 and directs that money to support the Famicos Foundation.
- HC1882 – Increases line 440-416, Mothers and Children Safety Net, by \$200,000 per year in order to provide hearing aides for children under the age of 21.

- HC2064 – Prohibits municipalities from treating a Supplemental Executive Retirement Plan in a different manner than they treat other retirement plans in regards to taxation.
- HC1961 – Establishes the Casino Control Commission Enforcement Fund.
- HC2067 – Raises the project limit for the Ohio Historical Preservation Tax Credit to \$10 million.
- HC1765 – Allows a Clerk of Courts to use money in the Automated Title Processing System Fund to pay for ribbons, cartridges and other devices necessary for the operation of the program.
- HC1597 – Re-appropriates a \$3 million capital appropriation for Blanchard Valley Flood Mitigation.
- HC1590 – Permits an e-school that serves at least grades one through eight to divide into two schools as long as the sponsor agrees and the division is accomplished in either the 2013 – 2014 or 2014 – 2015 school year.
- HC1991 – Creates the Hospital Readmissions Program Advisory Workgroup to develop and implement a hospital readmissions program.
- HC2005 – Corrects an error in the substitute bill regarding the taxation rate for compressed natural gas.
- HC1609 – Authorizes a non-chartered city to sell unused property to the county without first advertising the property for sale.
- HC1846 - Increases 035-405, Correctional Institution Inspection Commission, by \$21,945 yearly.
- HC1729 – Includes gifted unit funding in the list of core funding components. Requires a school district to use the funding it receives for gifted coordinator services or gifted intervention specialist services only for that purpose. Permits a school district to assign its gifted funding units to another education entity as part of an arrangement to provide gifted services.
- HC2063 – Eliminates a requirement with respect to the attribution of qualified rehabilitation expenses paid or incurred by an owner of a historic building who leases the building to a qualified lessee.
- HC1600 – Specifies that any student who receives a utility bill issued by a state university to be used as proof of residency for voting purposes must be given residency status by the Chancellor for purposes of receiving in-state tuition rates.
- HC1672 – Provides the amount equal to the difference between the aggregate amount paid in the current fiscal year for special education services for students with a severe behavioral handicap (SBH) and the amount that would have been calculated for those students in FY'01. This language was missing from the introduced version of the bill.
- HC2057 – Clarifies it is not an unlawful discriminatory practice for a person administering a civil service examination to obtain info about an applicant's military status to determine if they are eligible for the additional military credit.
- HC2014-1 – Appropriates \$950,000 in FY' 14 for the Ohio Strategic Training Center.
- HC1622-1 – Allows the Superintendent of Public Instruction to create an academic distress commission for any district found by the State Auditor to have knowingly manipulated student data with the intent to deceive.
- HC1774-1 – Revises provisions regarding the nursing facility quality incentive payments to require a facility to meet accountability measures for the following: 1) The use of a tool to track hospital admissions, 2) Vaccinations, 3) Requests for resident interviews, 4) Residents discussing care goals. Provides an additional \$30 million per year for quality incentive payments.

- HC1944-1 – Clarifies it is the intent of the General Assembly to enact conforming legislation if Congress passes the Marketplace Fairness Act.
  - HC1658-1 – Provides that an e-school is eligible to receive career technical education funding in addition to the core opportunity grant and special education funding.
  - HC1859 – Removes the requirement for the State Board of Education to revise minimum operating standards.
  - HC1981 – Revises the definition of instructional media as it relates Auxiliary Funds.
  - HC1720 – Creates the Truth, Justice and American Way license plate.
  - HC1599 – Permits a community school to charge tuition to a student who is not an Ohio resident.
  - HC1988 – Clarifies that preschool students identified as developmentally disabled are category two special education students for purposes of funding.
  - HC1637 – Maintains phonics as a part of reading instruction.
  - HC1786 – Inserts temporary law language tied to hospital reimbursement rates that was inadvertently left out of the substitute bill.
  - HC1634 – Prohibits the teaching of sexual education coursework that endorses student non-abstinence as an acceptable behavior or promotes sexual gateway activity.
  - HC1674 – Increases funding for 200-550, Foundation Funding, by \$700,000 per year for the Private Treatment Facility Project and provides funding for a youth in a residential treatment center for approved education programs at or near the center.
  - HC1709 – Compels the Director of Development Services to utilize the Edison Center Network in issuing grants for research and development or technology transfer thru the Edison program.
  - HC2061 – Requires that at least 50% of the \$20 million appropriation added in the substitute bill for addiction services be used to provide non-opiate drug treatment.
  - HC1725 – Provides that a school district may charge tuition for a student enrolled in all-day kindergarten as long as the student is counted as less than one full time equivalent student.
  - HC1638 – Restores current law related to financial reporting by school districts.
  - HC2060 – Increases 360-508, State Historical Grants, by \$400,000 per year and earmarks \$200,000 to the Cincinnati Museum Center and the Western Reserve Historical Society.
  - HC2062-1 – Redirects \$1 million in FY' 14 from the transfer to the Local Government Innovation Program to the Local Government Information Exchange, 100-460.
  - HC2033-1 – Renames the E-Tech Ohio Commission as the Broadcast Educational Media Commission and adjusts appropriations related to the re-establishment of this agency.
  - HC2054 – Removes a provision requiring local governments that publish certain data online to do so in a searchable format.
  - HC1989-1 – Revises the bills definition of “total student count” as it relates to an ESC.
  - HC2055 – Requires a public office that posts a public record on its website, or on a public website maintained by the state to post the information in a format that is capable of being searched by the public and is machine readable.
  - HC1659 – LSC Technical Amendment.
  - HC1629 – LSC Technical and Conforming Amendment.
  - HC1640-1 – LSC Corrective Amendment.
- Total appropriation changes reflected on attachment to the omnibus amendment.
